This year the YJFL undertook some extensive research into player retention, particularly in the U13 – U15 age groups. The key to their findings is that the number one factor in player retention is coaching. Kids are much more likely to come back the following year when they have had a good coaching experience the year before, conversely a bad coach means that players are much more likely to leave the sport, often never to return. With that in mind, whilst we have such a fantastic group of coaches as we had in 2015, St Marys will continue to be strong in the future.

Our team and age group managers are also second to none. Often undervalued & underappreciated, there are not too many tougher jobs than being a team or age group manager and I would like to thank all of our 24 team managers & 9 age group managers for all of their efforts and achievements.

When my family first joined St Marys, our slogan was the Biggest & the Best. We were justifiably proud of being the biggest, but due to changing demographics and increased competition from our neighbouring clubs these days have probably passed us by. However, this does not mean we stop striving to be the best, to have the best coaches, the best committee, the best managers, the best merchandise & equipment, the best football development & social development programs, the best social functions and the best facilities. Our challenge moving forward is making sure we are the best in all of these areas so we continue to encourage families to bypass their most local club, and make St Marys a destination.

Of all the achievements by committee this year, I have been most proud of our ability to look beyond the day to day, and towards the future.
